Purfleet on Thames will also bring to Purfleet:

- A new town centre with shops, restaurants and great public spaces
- A new medical centre, new primary school and new community facilities
- New parks and leisure spaces
- An improved railway station and transport facilities
- A new mini University campus focusing on healthcare, creative and business entrepreneurship (in later phases)
- Up to 2,850 new homes

Visitors to the exhibition at the Building Centre in Store street can see the very latest in architecture and design for health and educational institutions in London and the South East.

The exhibition at The Building Centre is free and visitors can also see NLA's giant interactive model of central London which brings the story of London's historical and physical development to life.

At 12.5 metres-long, the model covers more than 85 square kilometres of London, 19 Boroughs and approximately 170,000 buildings, including 34km of the Thames with its corresponding 21 bridges. It extends from King's Cross in the north to Peckham in the south and the Royal Docks in the east to Old Oak Common in the west.
